Please enter a start date on your paperwork that is at least 1 week after you submit into the HSS proposal portal.

To find an internship, there are resources provided by your department, and The Career Center lists many opportunities for students in HSS.

Proposal Process:

1. Students should verify that they are eligible (TCNJ GPA of 2.0 and at least 3 earned TCNJ units). Students may count no more than 3 units of internship toward a TCNJ degree.
2. Students interested in completing an internship for academic credit need to work with a faculty sponsor to write an internship course proposal that contains:
 1. "The proposal should state the number of credit hours from any previous internship, as well as the semester taken and the firm, institution, or agency where the internship was completed.
 2. The proposal must explain exactly how credits are to be earned, what on-the-job activities will be required of the intern, and how these activities relate to program learning goals and objectives.
 3. The proposal must describe the methods of evaluating the internship to be used by the faculty supervisor, which may include evaluation(s) by the on-site supervisor.
 4. The proposal must specify learning goals and objectives. The learning goals may be general to all internships in a department (at a particular course level) and/or be specific to the particular internship experience."

Overload Policy

The normal course load for HSS majors is 4 units but students may take up to 4.5 units without permission. Students who have earned 8 units at the college and maintain a 3.3 cumulative TCNJ GPA may request an overload for a maximum of 5 course units in any one semester. There is no maximum limit to the number of overload semesters.

- You should complete the online Overload Interest Form found at: <https://hss.tcnj.edu/resources/current-students/forms/>
- Completing the form will automatically generate an email that will be sent to your Department Chair, who will reach out to you for advising. They may ask you why you are requesting the overload, review your academic record, and talk to you about the advantages and disadvantages of overloading given your proposed coursework. The Department Chair will communicate directly with the Associate Dean. She will then correspond with you about your overload request.
